The 2023 Mercurey Clos L'Evêque Ier Cru comes from east-facing vines that stretch from the bottom to the top. This is quite perfumed on the nose with brambly red fruit, pressed rose petal and a touch of crushed stone. The palate is medium-bodied and fresh, with fine tannins and crisp acidity. A sapid finish beckons you back. This is a worthy follow-up to the 2022 and will drink well for several years.

The 2023 Monthélie Clos du Meix Garnier is a monopole belonging to Domaine de Belleville. This has an attractive, finely delineated bouquet with red cherry and wild strawberry fruit, a light musk scent lingering in the background. The palate is medium-bodied with pliant tannins, neatly integrated oak (25% new), and a touch of blackcurrant and bilberry toward the finish. Give this a year in bottle and you'll have a fine, sturdy Monthélie.
